

| Update to measles PCR ordering 3.20.2024 | |
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| What? | Ohio Department of Health (ODH) now requires local health departments to approve need for measles testing before processing PCRs. |
| So what? | This additional requirements may help decrease unnecessary testing in children who have a low likelihood of active measles but also could limit prompt diagnosis of measles cases. |
| Now what? | Notify CCHMC Infection Prevention & Control on-call when ordering measles PCR testing. They will contact the local health department and include clinical information for prompt approval of testing. Independent practices may call their local health department directly. Providers should have relevant clinical information for patient at the time of IP&C notification such as: Clinical criteria: Generalized rash AND fever AND cough, coryza, and/or conjunctivitis Patient exposures and vaccine status Provider contact information available for public health if they have additional questions. If the test has already been obtained, the lab can store it until they receive notification by public health that is approved for transport and processing. |

Continue to be aware of potential measles cases in our area. Ensure to order the appropriate testing and isolation when ruling out a case.

- Please continue to be alert for cases of measles in your areas in response to the 2/2/24 Montgomery County measles cluster and the Disney on Ice exposure on 3/8.
 - o Remember, if the patient is vaccinated, measles is a highly unlikely diagnosis!
 - o Many unvaccinated children who have a fever and rash will not have measles; assess for alternative diagnoses if measles is epidemiologically unlikely.
 - Do not refer patients to the ED or urgent care for testing only.
 - If a patient needs to be referred for testing or clinical evaluation, notify the facility prior to the patient's arrival.
- Place patient in N-95 Airborne precautions right away if you suspect measles (airborne infection isolation room + N-95 respirator for providers). Measles is a Class A reportable illness requiring all suspected cases to be immediately reported to public health. If those resources are not available, place the patient in a private room and keep the door closed.
- Complete rule out testing for measles requires the following:
 - Notification of Infection Prevention & Control or the local health department directly (for independent practices). ODH is no longer accepting tests if patients do not meet



<u>clinical criteria for measles.</u> Clinical criteria includes 1) a generalized rash AND 2) fever AND 3) cough, coryza, or conjunctivitis.

- Measles serologies (send out to ARUP)
 - Rubeola (Measles) IgG
 - Rubeola (Measles) IgM

- Measles PCR (Send out to ODH)
 - If ODH gets a positive result, the CDC reports to IN, KY or OH depending on the residency of the patient.
 - If an area in the hospital wants to collect a PCR sample for measles, they can call Send Outs (513-636-3061) M-F 6:00AM-6:30 PM or Lab Support (513-636-6165) is available 24/7.
 - For community providers: Can call ODH Emergency Response (614-722-7221) if unsure of next steps.
 - Ordering person would request:
 - Viral transport media
 - Dacron tipped swab
 - Ice Pack
 - Ordering Instructions:
 - Order as an "Unlisted Lab":
 - Test Name : Measles PCR ODH
 - o Specimen type needed: Nasopharyngeal or oropharyngeal
 - Container type needed for collection: Viral transport media container
 - Enter special instructions (i.e. name and address of lab to perform tests if not CCHMC): -70 storage
