

Penicillin Allergy Decision and Mobile Empowerment (PADME)

Parents of children with unverified penicillin allergy labels are encouraged to use **Penicillin Allergy Decision and Mobile Empowerment (PADME)**, to <u>initiate</u> the penicillin allergy de-labeling process.

Parents can complete a simple online assessment at http://www.padmeallergy.org/ to receive their child's personalized risk certificate to share with their child's doctors.

Parents will also receive risk-based guidance about the next steps necessary for removing or testing a penicillin allergy label. Steps may include de-labeling with their primary care doctor <u>or</u> testing through allergy specialists, such as Cincinnati Children's <u>Penicillin Allergy Testing Services (PATS)</u> clinic.
